



The facility will include a clinical library, meeting and teaching rooms, and quiet areas. In addition a Patient working Information Room which will include information for patients and their families will be included in the plans.

The opening of the new Library is on course for February 2015 – so not long now before we will be able to provide a library we can be proud of, one that, as a large teaching hospital, will provide access to quality training, education and resources for the next generations of doctors and health

staff as well as the medical and nursing

students at the two local universities.

Babies who do survive can be left with lifelong disabilities such as cerebral palsy. Until recently there have been no treatments available to improve the outcomes for affected infants. However, a new treatment has been found to help which involves lowering the temperature of the baby shortly after birth. Cooling their body using a blanket or mattress filled with cooled fluid slows down the rate of damage in the brain. Babies can be cooled in this way in specialist intensive care units in Leicester, Nottingham, Coventry and Wolverhampton but for affected

babies born in one of the other 14 maternity units across the Midlands, the start of treatment can be delayed by several hours during transportation with the CenTre team to the nearest available unit. To address this delay, Leicester Hospitals Charity now want to raise £60,000 to install two dedicated ambulances with the cooling equipment so treatment can begin immediately once the sick baby is on board. 




