
Welcome to the August edition of the GP Newsletter

Changes to General Paediatrics

From August 2016 all referrals for an acute assessment on the Children's Assessment Unit (CAU) should be made via the on call Paediatric Registrar. This should allow improved screening of the referral and a better quality service for our colleagues in primary care.

In addition from 14 September 2016 the Children's Assessment Unit at the Royal will move location to Ward 14

Level 4 Balmoral building. The telephone numbers will remain the same.

General Paediatric Advice Hotline

This is a new service for the health care professionals in Leicester and Leicestershire.

It allows access to the General Paediatric consultant team Monday to Friday between 9am and 5pm.

The advice line has been set up in order to answer the many questions about the care of paediatric patients that can arise. It will hopefully provide expect advice in a timely fashion and ensure the right care can be delivered for all of our region's paediatric population.

It is not intended to be used for straightforward referrals for review although this may still be the outcome agreed.

Sickle Cell and Thalassemia Nursing Service New telephone number



From 01 September 2016 changes will be made to the Sickle Cell and Thalassemia Nursing Service.

In order to ensure that the service continues to provide effective, safe and efficient care, the team currently located within the Merlyn Vaz Centre will be relocated to Haemaglobinopathies unit at the Royal Infirmary.

The team will be contactable on a new telephone number 0116 258 6081

As you are aware all babies are screened for Sickle Cell and Thalassemia shortly after birth and the results of these tests are sent by the screening service directly to the GP practice. Please could you ensure that these results are passed onto the parents at the 6-week baby check or at the earliest opportunity. The nursing team will then provide a telephone follow-up in order to further discuss the results. These are rare conditions and if you would like further information from the service regarding the receipt of abnormal results and the

implications for the parents and child, nurses would be willing to provide an opportunity for learning and to raise awareness of the conditions.

STOP... Before Referring, Consider Advice and Guidance

Service Name: Adult General Dermatology Service - Dermatology - LRI - RWE

There is a seasonal increase in referrals to Dermatology during the summer months but there are now only 5 Dermatology Consultants in the team.

Before referring, please consider using Advice and Guidance on the NHS E-Referral Service system. Your request will be answered by the on-call Consultant Dermatologist, usually within 2-5 days

Analysis of data from October 2014 – October 2015 showed that out of 90 Advice and Guidance requests to Dermatology, only 27 patients required referral to the department. Please use our Advice and Guidance service, and do not refer to UHL Dermatology unless you think it is absolutely necessary.

Would you like to participate in a

National Influenza Surveillance Scheme?

Public Health England are again running an Influenza Surveillance Scheme for the coming Winter season and would like to recruit GP practices in LLR to participate.

Each will be asked to provide nose and throat specimens from up to ten patients per week with an influenza-like illness for a maximum period from week 40 to week 20.

A small financial award is available for participation in this scheme.

There is a requirement to state on the specimen form:

- whether the patient had fever and cough in the previous 7 days;
- the patient's vaccination status (including whether the vaccine was administered intranasally or by injection);
- if they fall into the Department of Health's defined risk group for influenza vaccination;
- whether the patient had been prescribed antiviral drugs in the previous 14 days.
