Medical Continence Clinic.

The Medical Continence Clinic is aimed at elderly patients and patients with complex medical or neurological conditions that have developed bladder/bowel dysfunction.

Referral Criteria

- **Frail Older Person with one or more of the following:**
 - Previous admission to Hospital with:
 - Urinary Tract Infection.
 - Constipation.
 - Impaction.
 - Nocturia.
 - Falls linked to bladder/bowel dysfunction.
- > Recurrent falls at home linked to urgency and/or frequency of micturition, nocturia.
- > Bladder and Bowel Dysfunction impacting on patient or patient's carer's quality of life.
- > Faecal Incontinence.
- Failed previous conservative treatments.
 - Patient over 65years of age with significant co-morbidities plus bladder or bowel dysfunction.
 - Adults with bladder and/or bowel dysfunction secondary to their neurological condition- eg: MS, CVA, Parkinson 's disease, Diabetes.

All elderly patients will receive a Comprehensive Geriatric Assessment alongside a full assessment of their bladder/bowel dysfunction.

- Referrals are also accepted for the Continence Specialist Nurse for the following:
 - Teaching and review of intermittent Self-catheterisation.
 - Sheath Fitting.
 - Bladder retraining.
 - Continence Aids.
